Math/Science
We will take one giant leap into our space exploration this month. We will use non-fiction books to learn about our planets and their characteristics. Our moon walk will conclude our unit where we will look for moon rocks in our texture table, sit on the moon for a little bit and taste freeze dried ice cream and fruit. Our health/nutrition unit we will explore the human body and discuss how we can take good care of urselves.

Fine Motor

Our hand grips will be put to work while we look for moon rocks using tongs. We are going to trace a human body and draw in many of our organs and bones as well as label them together. We will work on writing the letters K & A this month. During our 3 little pigs unit, we are going to recreate the 3 houses by drawing, painting and gluing objects into the houses.

Reading/Writing

During our 3 little pigs unit, we will be reading a variety of books that tell the story. Each one is very different, but also the same. The children have gotten very good at making contrasts and comparisons between stories from other units like this. As stated above, we will also give the children the opportunity to look at a book of the human body and draw and label different parts. Keep an eye out for our finished product near the end of the month!


